Students must be at least 14 & ½ years old at the time of the class to be eligible to participate. **(Letters have been mailed home to these students.)** Driver's Education requires 30 hours of classroom time, so if your child is absent more than 1 day they will not pass the class. (State law only allows students to miss one class period.) Class days/hours are Monday-Thursday, 8:00-12:00 classroom time (complimentary breakfast & lunch will be provided). The class is limited to 27 students and we accept students from oldest to youngest.
